



This Week in Primary Care PC4AA Outreach Builds Communities Locally and Builds Our Enterprise Nationally

PC4AA's signature principle is Community-Built, Community Fit. A recent presentation about successful community outreach by PC4AA's Queens Borough New York Workgroup leadership offered a great example. Their work energizing their community also energizes the entire PC4AA enterprise. That's why we're all here!

The Queens New York PC4AA Workgroup team recently visited a local mosque, gathering feedback on primary care topics and collecting video content for the team's use in translating commentary to changes. Primary care physicians' availability was a top concern, expressed in terms of appointment availability, wait times, and the need for evening hours. The receptivity and positivity of those discussions turned into organizing a health fair in September or October with the mosque's support. The Workgroup team includes a local radio station representative, publicity and follow-up are assured.

In another outreach action the Queens Workgroup members visited the school involved with their future provider "Pipeline" program. This program grew out of a local physician's own experience growing up in the area and finding means to bolster her own commitment as home-grown aspiring Primary Care professional. Replicating her own journey, the "Pipeline" seeks out, rewards and supports high school students' interests in healthcare careers in their own neighborhood. "Pipeline" participants can get stipend-supported training and experience in neighborhood healthcare settings. This bolsters confidence in career aspirations and affirms hopes to serve amidst a familiar community. This benefits everyone.

Another key element of PC4AA strategy modeled in Queens Borough is researching and updating local, state, and national statistics on provider shortages for the purpose of framing the presentation for local public and community health policymakers and planners. The Workgroup makes sure that elected and appointed officials can see PC4AA works as partnerships for their own community benefit agendas.

By these means PC4AA cultivates future Primary Care providers to become professionals, stay local, and experience a supportive political environment. This approach illustrates PC4AA principles of engagement by

leveraging authentic local stories, bolstering them with evidence frameworks, and demonstrating practical, actionable solutions.

PC4AA has embraced a daunting task. Inspiring, uplifting stories keep the enterprise energized, to in turn build support and improve tools for energizing those out on the line every day.

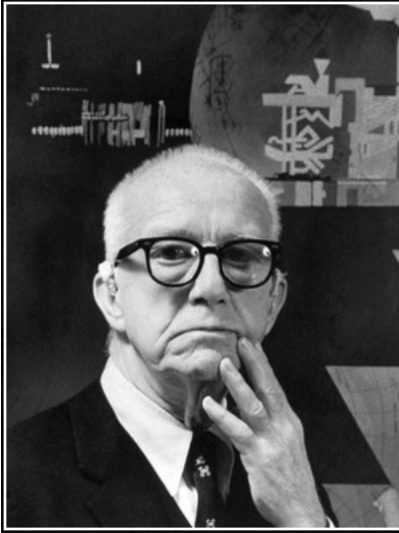
